Dear Sturgeon Pointers:

A short and mild winter has come and gone since I last wrote one of these newsletters. The ice went out on March 19th, which is twenty days earlier than last year. With spring off to such an early start, I'm hoping that we are in for a long and warm summer season.

The summer of 2012 will feature one of the busiest calendars in recent history here at the Point. There is barely a single weekend without something happening somewhere. I've described a number of these events in this newsletter. You'll be able to find updates and a complete calendar of events on our web site. We'll also be posting the calendar of events on our bulletin boards at the Park and the mailboxes.

2012 SPA MEMBERSHIPS

At the top of SPA's list of priorities at the start of each year is our annual membership drive. Since the Village was amalgamated in the year 2001 the community has generously supported their association,

and much has been accomplished in the intervening years. This year we've decided to redouble our efforts so that we can bring our membership rolls to the levels that we saw several years ago.

If you received this letter in the mail then you've probably received a membership form in the same envelope. Extra forms are available online if you need more. I encourage each adult member of every cottage and residence to take out a SPA membership this year. Membership is still just \$35/person. You can mail us your completed forms along with a cheque or just drop it off directly into the SPA mailbox at the Park.

As most of you understand, we have a rather unique situation here in Sturgeon Point. Through the foresight of the Village Council prior to amalgamation we now manage some of our own community properties. These properties were not transferred to the City when our Village was amalgamated. These "Trust Lands" include the Park, the Public Beach, the Upper Wharf, and the Leaf Dump. As a community, we manage these lands in a way that the City could not. (For example, you won't find a swim raft at a Cityrun beach, or a beautiful children's playground designed and built by the local community, independent of the CoKL.) The Leaf Dump saves many of us a significant amount of time and money every year. These and other benefits come with a responsibility, and part of that responsibility includes a financial commitment. As you can see from the other parts of this newsletter, SPA organises a number of

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community events and activities that serve to maintain and promote Sturgeon Point traditions, some of which are well over a century old. Your membership dollars are the primary source of funding all of this activity, and because we are all volunteers, those dollars go a very long way. Please become a 2012 SPA member.

UPPER WHARF PROJECT

Last year we addressed the worsening erosion problem at the Upper Wharf grounds with the addition of a natural stone stairway leading down to the waterfront and a concrete swale along the edge of Irene Avenue. The swale (financed by the City of Kawartha Lakes) worked well over the spring run-off season and looks to have solved the erosion problem. The stairway provides easy and safe access to the waterfront area.

The project will be completed this year with the installation of a railing along one side of the stairs and three bollards along the top of the grass slope adjacent to the stairs. Two permanent bollards have already been installed, and a third removable bollard will be installed between the first two. The bollards, which will be painted and capped, will provide easy pedestrian and stroller access to the Upper Wharf grounds while restricting vehicle access. The stone stairs and the railings have been paid for primarily through reserves accrued through membership revenues, with extra help from the CoKL's matching grant program.

We'll soon be installing a cedar bench over the ugly cement block on the pad area. The bench will serve two purposes: it will provide needed extra seating and also hide the otherwise useless cement block.

The next step is to rejuvenate the gardens and surrounding green areas on the property. This is a longer term project, and Nelia Steward has generously volunteered to act as the point person. Nelia is looking for help from people with green thumbs, green ideas, any colour plants to donate, or red muscles to exercise. ROADS

The CoKL recently went through a five year roads needs assessment to guide road maintenance and infrastructure budgets. The outcome of that assessment has resulted in a decision that excludes Sturgeon Point from any road resurfacing work in 2012. This may come as a disappointment to those of you who live on Forest Road and Henry Street, as well as some of you on Lake Avenue and Fourth Street. While Sturgeon Point has benefited from some significant road work over the past two years, the job isn't quite done yet. We will continue to communicate this message to the City.

Last year the City cut back some brush from Forest Road at our request. Several cautionary signs and speed limit signs were posted along Forest Road and Lake Avenue, as well as on Irene Avenue near the Park to alert drivers to the presence of children.

Those of you driving around the Village will have noticed that the winter sand deposits are still on our streets. We have word that the street cleaners are on their way.

Several of our street signs are in need of replacement, and we are in the process of cataloging these and communicating them to the CoKL. The intent is to replace them with similar hand-painted signs that match the originals to maintain the look and character of the Village.

Please remember to drive slowly when you're in the Point.
