2010 SPA Membership

All of your membership dollars go towards the support of activities that benefit and enhance our community in one way or another. Here's a list of the more significant items in our budget:

- 1. The maintenance of and insurance for all of the properties that are in Trust for the residents of Sturgeon Point. These are:
 - a. The Park in the Woods
 - b. The Public Beach (including the swim raft, furniture, and access ladders)
 - c. The Upper Wharf
 - d. The Leaf Dump
- 2. Flowers and Beautification throughout the Point;
- 3. Maintenance of a community web site and other communications activities;
- 4. The Social Functions that bring everyone together:
 - a. The "Welcome to Summer" gathering at the Park on July 3rd;
 - b. The Civic Weekend Street Dance and BBQ at the Park;
 - c. The Annual Sturgeon Point Regatta, which includes the Running Races and Water Races.

SPA has also undertaken larger scale projects that have included the preservation of the Upper Wharf building and the more recent renovation of the Park in the Woods.

In addition to these local activities, SPA acts as your liaison with the City of Kawartha Lakes on issues that affect our Village. SPA is also involved with a number of local conservation groups, allowing us to stay up to date and contribute to local environmental issues.

These activities just wouldn't be possible without your continued financial support. Your Board of Directors are very active, and we continuously review our budgets to get the most out of our limited resources. However, our maintenance and insurance costs have continued to rise annually.

Roads

This summer Lake Avenue will be repaved all the way from Sturgeon Point Road to Irene Ave. The short section of Irene Ave. from Lake Road up past the Church to where it intersects with Forest Road will also be repaved. While this could bring some disruption this summer, the work is badly needed. We hope that the work progresses quickly and painlessly. We are also hoping that the side streets receive similar attention next summer.

Sturgeon Lake Environmental Management Plan

This year we are sponsoring an Environmental Meeting on July 10th at 10:00 a.m. at the Sturgeon Point Union Church. Rob Messervey, Chief Administration Officer of the Kawartha Lakes Conservation Authority will present an overview of the scope and objectives of the Sturgeon Lake Plan. The presentation will review the process and people involved. You can also expect a discussion on the stewardship program initiatives and activities that shoreline owners and associations can avail themselves of to make individual and collective contributions toward healthy shorelines and a healthier lake. Rob will be looking for support from our association in achieving their objectives.

Park and Village Spring Cleanup Bee

On Saturday, May 22, at 9:00 a.m. there will be a Park and Village Spring Cleanup Bee. Bring your rake, shovel, broom, and recycling bags and head to the Park.
